As at 13 July 2023, the balance of CS Grant is <u>\$249,550.00.</u>

After the resumption of normal school time-table in the second half of school year, two learning activities were held.

- (1) Visit to the HK Palace Museum by S.5 students (7th March, 2023) transportation was arranged from school
 - Activity Aim: (1) EM students have a taste of imperial (royal court life of) China, i.e. Ching Dynasty; (2) to have a better understanding of the cultural heritage and the new museum in West Kowloon Cultural District
 - Special arrangement was made by a member of youth group under the CPPCC for our students' free admission. Transportation was arranged from school to the HKPM.
 - Students spent 2-3 hours browsing through different galleries. English-speaking curators were arranged and they gave a brief explanation of different exhibits.
 - Students were positive about the visit.

- (2) Mainland Study Tour to Zhuhai (Aviation Industry) by S.5 students (End of May, 2023) expenses were mainly on visa applications and one-day sim cards for teachers
 Aim: (1) students have first-hand experience of recent development of Mainland China; (2) to supplement lesson learning of Mainland China
 - Once the HK-Mainland border was open, EDB helped the arrangement of mainland study tour. A one-day tour on development of technology of Mainland China for easier reception by EM students was chosen.
 - A lot of preparation was needed within a short period time; most importantly time spent on the application of Home-Return Permit, Visas to China and their own non-HKSAR passports after 3-year of pandemic in Hong Kong.
 - Unexpectedly, we spent more time at the immigration counters at Zhuhai and missed the morning session. After arrival, we had lunch and enjoyed visiting the plane manufacturing plant, exhibition hall, viewing platform of the Zhuhai Airport, robot-game, lecture on development of amphibious planes in the afternoon session. We also travelled on the HK-Zhuhai-Macau Bridge.
 - Students were positive about the tour except the heat.
 - We may plan for a longer mainland study tour in the following years.
